

ATTRACTIONS

This is an intact and wild land, full of crystal-clear waters, rocky peaks, thick woods, but also abounding in marks left by man and his activities.

A real natural gem, completely uninhabited and silent, crossed by a dense network of paths.

Another really interesting feature is represented by the signs of the military presence during the First World War. The mountain crests were the sites of the second front line for several years, and here many special war constructions were built, mountain shelters and defence structures, little dormitories and dug-outs. Excursions to the Vuâlt shelter, the old military hospital, Bianchi Bivouac and the Rio Alba springs are obligatory visits for anyone wishing to experience the authentic essence of the Reserve.

between the Alps and Pre-Alps and the Carnic and Julian Alps.
The different and complex heights create a mosaic-like atmosphere that reflects the rich variety of animal and plant species that manage to survive in such diverse chorological situations.

These bird species are typical to this Alpine sector, which is also known for the presence of Ungulates and the migration of the large carnivores (the bear and the lynx) from Slovenia.

ITINERARIES

The valley can be entered from three charming villages situated on the slopes of the mountain: Dordolla, Pradis and Ovedasso. Both trained hikers and families with children can enjoy the charm of the mountains along numerous trails, cobbled tracks and mule paths across the valley, immersed in the silence of the woods, reaching as far as the tops of the mountains. For example, you can go for a walk to the Vuâlt shelter and wood, or turn off towards the Bianchi Bivouac, the Rio Alba springs or the remains military refuge, discovering natural, historical and anthropic features along the way. There is a wide choice for experienced hikers, too. They're sure to enjoy a climb up the Creta dei Russei, Cuel Brusât, or from Monte Crostis to Çuc dal Bôr. The valley offers plenty of opportunity for environmental education, with its educational paths around the Vuâlt shelter, as well as recreational and tourist activities.


HOW TO GET TO THE RISERVE

> FRUM THE SUUTH:
MOTORWAY A23 PALMANOVA-TARVISIO, EXIT AT CARNIA, CONTINUE TOWARDS TARVISIO TO MOGGIO UDINESE.

> FROM THE NORTH:
MOTORWAY A23 PALMANOVA TARVISIO, EXIT PONTEBBA, CONTINUE TOWARDS UDINE ON THE NATIONAL ROAD PONTEBBANA
S.S. 13 AND FOLLOW THE SIGNS FOR MOGGIO UDINESE. IN BOTH CASES CONTINUE ALONG THE PROVINCIAL ROAD 112
TOWARDS VAL AUPA AND FOLLOW THE SIGNS TO THE RESERVE OF VAL ALBA.
