Challenges & Lessons learned – 1. Content and Format

Too much content for 5 days



Offer various **types of training** with customized content depending on the beneficiaries or targets:

➤ Reduction in **duration**:

2 days for decision makers

3 days for beginners

5 days for in-depth training



Option 1 : Beginner level, advanced level (two syllabi)



Option 2 : Different foci (policy, scientific, operational)



Option 3 : Individualize training (develop further modules / more detailed and use as ToolBox)




Option 4 : Organize two phases (CC and One Health)



Option 5 : Do a separate training on CRVAs and HNAPs

Challenges & Lessons learned – 2. Methodology

- ❖ Too little variation in methodological approaches



- Keep the methodology of Day 4
 - In-depth work on different disease groups (airborne, water- and foodborne, vector-borne diseases)
 - Application of the Assessment Report (AR5) Framework
 - Application of Health Adaptation Framework (10 components by WHO)
- Additional propositions:
 - Field trip, especially with respect to mitigation (e.g. visiting a health facility that has already measures in place)
 - “Discussion Walk” – participants gets a topic to discuss, can get to know each other better and keep energy levels higher

Challenges & Lessons learned – 3. Geography

- ❖ Keep the regional approach




- Advantages of regional **participants**:
 - Countries on different level of implementation can learn from each other → reduces the “in our context it is impossible” feeling
 - Sharing of resources and experiences → no reinventing the wheel
- Advantages of a regional **trainer** :
 - Knows the context (political, scientific, cultural)
 - Allows openness and directness
 - Many references from the context (experiences, documents, etc)

- Recommendation: conduct the same training for **Anglophone** African & Asian countries

Challenges & Lessons learned – 4. Practical Recommendations

- ✓ Taking into account the training framework (trainer, participants, priorities), be **flexible on the order of the modules**
- ✓ **Share documentation and tools** with participants at the end of the training
 - USB sticks with relevant literature, PowerPoints and pictures of the training
 - Tools that are mentioned during the trainings (such as SORMAS, AKDN Carbon-Tool)
- ✓ Create a **database of suitable trainers** for this topic
- ✓ Ensure the **inclusion of transversal topics** (gender, reproductive health) and make a clear link with **One Health**
